## 2018 Medical Expense Summary Worksheet

To expedite the preparation of your tax return, you may use this worksheet to summarize your medical and dental expenses.

It is important for you to keep the receipts with your tax documents as supporting evidence in the event of an IRS question or audit; however, we only need your medical expenses summarized as follows:

\*New Threshold for 2019 tax year: The IRS allows you to deduct qualified medical expenses that exceed 7.5% of your adjusted gross income for 2017 and 2018. Beginning Jan. 1, 2019, all taxpayers may deduct only the amount of the total unreimbursed allowable medical care expenses for the year that exceeds 10% of their adjusted gross income.

Example:

If your Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) is \$100,000 and your medical/dental expenses total \$10,000 you will only be able to deduct \$2500 of those medical/dental expenses on Schedule A.

 $$100,000 (AGI) \times 7.5\% = $7500.00 \text{ thus } $10,000 (total medical/dental expenses)} - $7500 (7.5\% of AGI) = $2500 (amount to show on Schedule A)$
